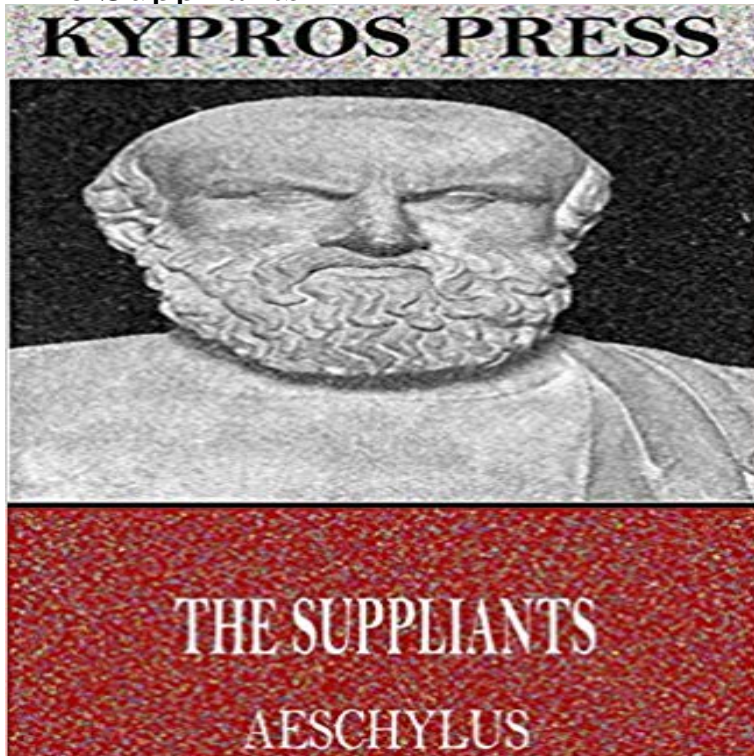


The Suppliants
