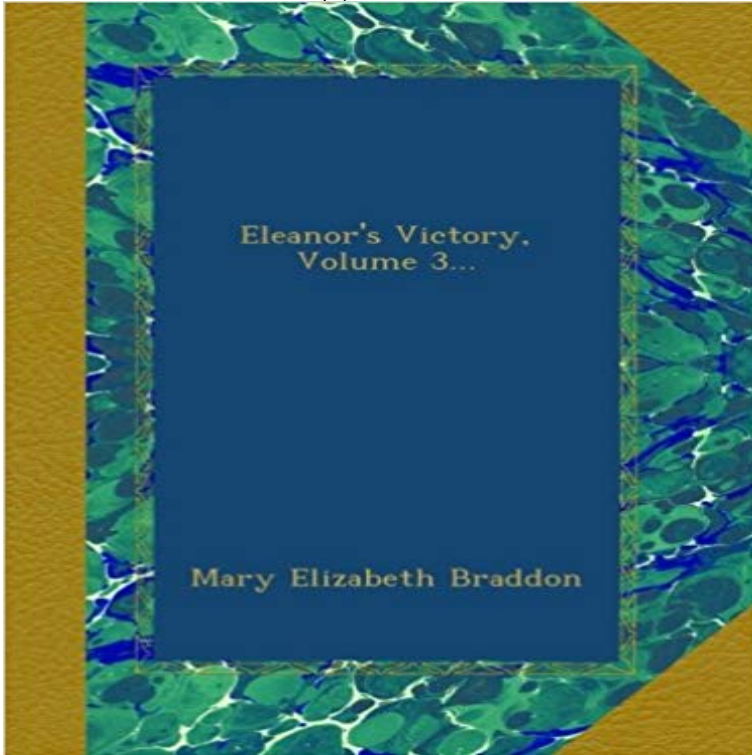


Eleanors Victory, Volume 3...
