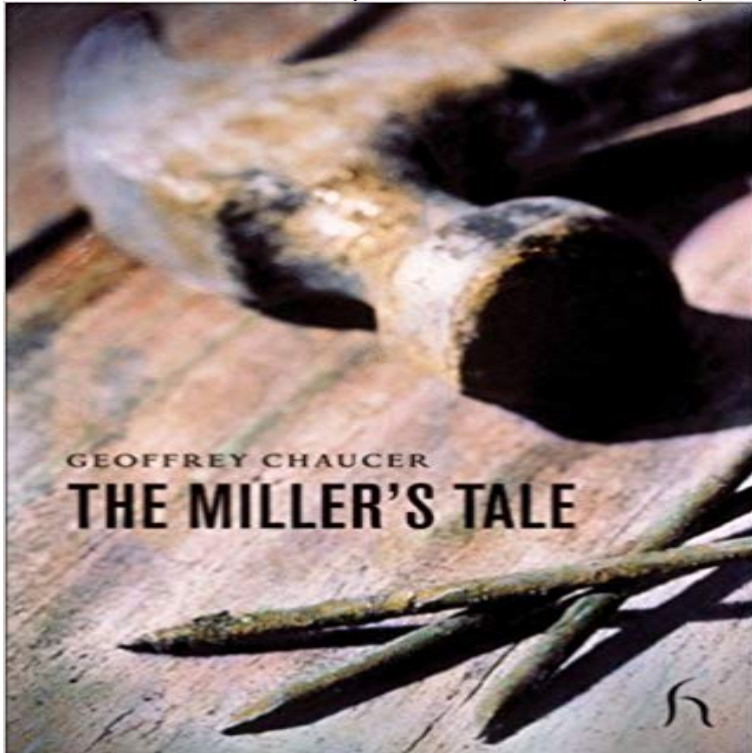


## The Millers Tale (Canterbury Tales)
