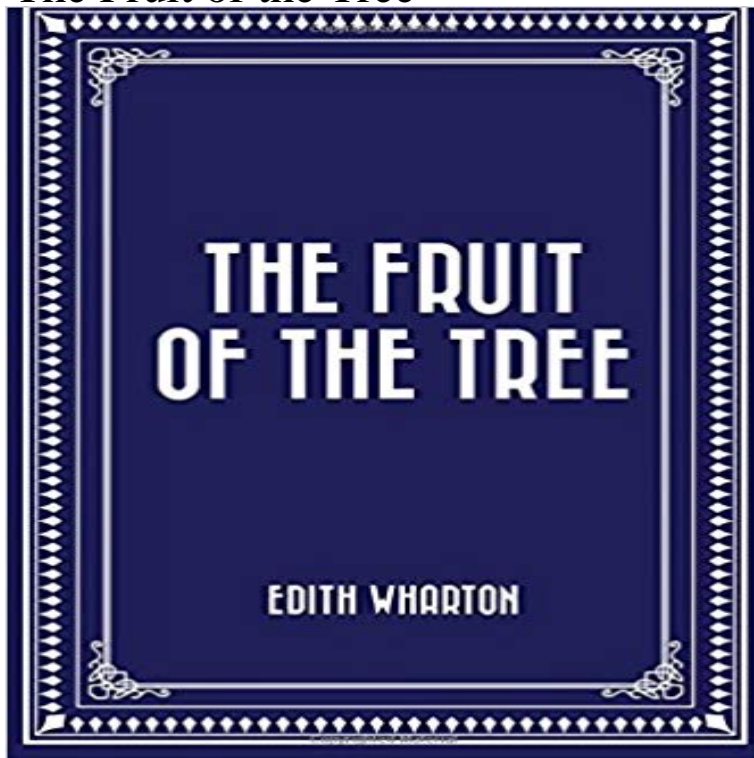


The Fruit of the Tree
