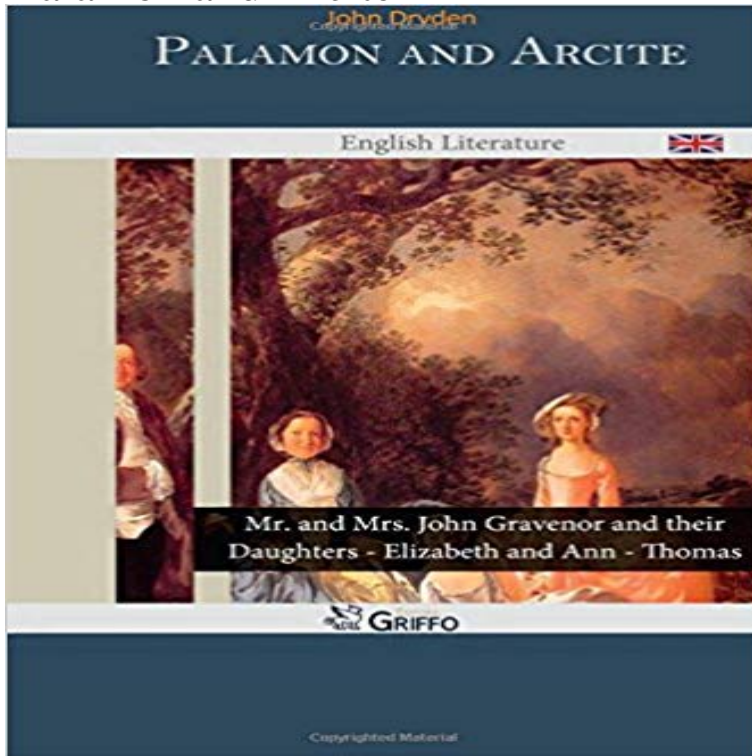


Palamon and Arcite
