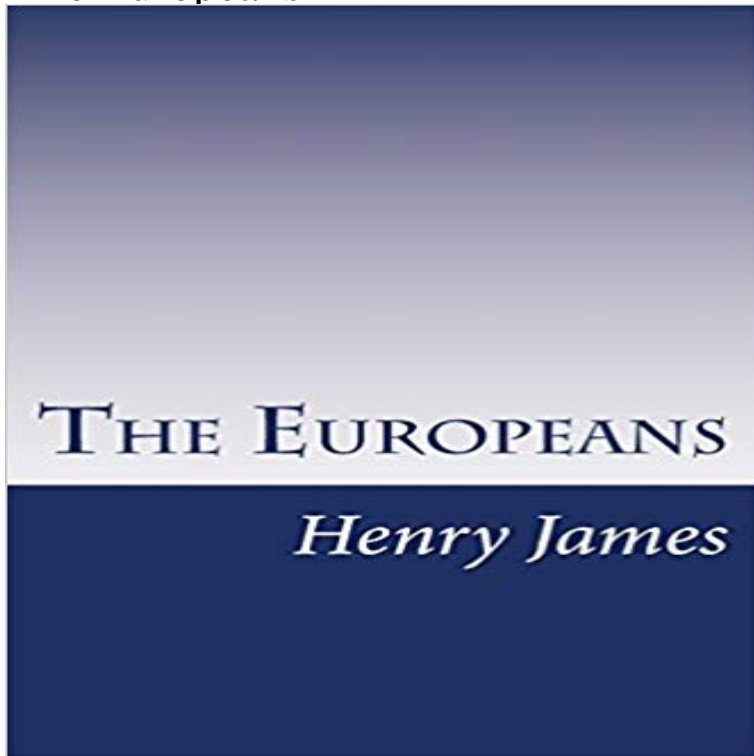


The Europeans

Here she paused a moment, gave a pinch to her waist with her two hands, or raised these membersthey were very plump and prettyto the multifold braids of her hair, with a movement half caressing, half corrective. An attentive observer might have fancied that during these periods of desultory self-inspection her face forgot its

melancholy; but as soon as she neared the window again it began to proclaim that she was a very ill-pleased woman. And indeed, in what met her eyes there was little to be pleased with.
